# **APPLE DESCRIPTIONS**

## **Cortland**

Ripens early October.

Large fruit with crimson striped skin. Firm, fine grained, juicy, tart and tangy, crisp white flesh is slow to discolor after exposure to air. Good for baking, sauce, salads, in-hand-eating and cider.

Excellent pollinator. Trees are hardy to at least -30 degrees F.

## **Empire**

Ripens late September - October.

Medium sized fruit with waxy yellow skin covered with a bright red blush. Creamy white flesh is firm, juicy, crisp and aromatic with a clean sweet, sprightly flavor. Good quality baking, cider and in hand eating apple.

Exceptional keeper when stored cool. Very hardy, heavy bearing trees.

## **Fuji**

Ripens mid-late October.

Large fruit with rosy pink stripes over a golden background. The very sweet, flavorful flesh is firm, crunchy, and very juicy. Great cooking, sauce and in-hand-eating apple.

Exceptional storage life (up to 5 or 6 months if kept cool). Heat resistant. Very vigorous growing trees. Excellent pollinator.

## **Granny Smith**

Ripens late October - November.

Medium to large, green skinned fruit (possibly pinkish in colder climates). Tart, crisp, firm and juicy white flesh with a good balance of acids and sugars. Slow to discolor after exposure to air. Excellent for in-hand-eating, sauce and juice. Exceptional baking apple as holds texture and never becomes mushy.

Excellent keeper (up to 5 months in storage). Holds well in heat. Good pollinator.

## **Honey Crisp**

Ripens mid September - mid October.

Medium sized fruit, mottled orange-red over a yellow background. Crisp, juicy cream colored flesh with a mild to sweetly aromatic flavor depending upon maturity. Considered one of the best for fresh eating.

Excellent keeper. Bears at an early age. Outstanding winter hardiness.

## **Gala**

Ripens September - early October.

Medium to small, red flushed, thin skinned fruit. Crisp yet soft, juicy, creamy yellow flesh with a mild, sweet flavor. Good for in-hand-eating and salads.

Very good keeper. Very hardy and heat resistant cultivar.

## **Macoun**

Ripens September - early October.

Medium to large fruit, dark red over a green background. Firm, crisp, and juicy snow white flesh with an extra sweet, aromatic flavor. High quality, all purpose apple. Excellent for baking, sauce and in-hand-eating.

Very hardy cultivar.

## **McIntosh**

Ripens late September.

Medium to large fruit with smooth, thin and tender, solid red skin. Firm, crisp, juicy and sweet white flesh sometimes stained with red streaks. Excellent for in-hand-eating. Good for cooking and cider.

Keeps into January in cold storage. Excellent pollinator. Very hardy cultivar.

## **Northern Spy**

Ripens late October - early November.

Large fruit with smooth, thin skin of greenish-yellow flushed and striped with dark red. Fine grained, rather firm, tender, crisp and juicy flesh with a tart, spicy, aromatic flavor. Good in-hand-eating apple. Tops for baking, sauce and cider.

Excellent keeper. Very hardy and vigorous cultivar.

## **Red Delicious (Double)**

Ripens late September - October.

Dark red skin and fine grained, tender, crisp and juicy flesh with a very sweet flavor. One of the most popular in-hand-eating apples.

Holds crispness and flavor until May if stored well. Very hardy cultivar.

## **Spartan**

Ripens mid October.

Medium sized, mahogany red dessert quality apple with pure white flesh and a crisp sweet, slightly acidic, highly aromatic flavor.

Consistently heavy bearer. Hardy and disease resistant.

## **Yellow (Golden) Delicious**

Ripens mid September to late October

Large conic golden yellow fruit. Firm, crisp, juicy flesh with a mild but sweet distinctive flavor. High quality all purpose apple.

Bears very young. Partially self-fertile.
